at the North Central Correctional Institute in Marion, Ohio. Puppet Man is inspired by real-life events
about a group of inmates who start a puppet theater. He is also the author of Bitten by a Boomsiang,

Left Coast Theater Company was formed in the Spring of 2012 from the successful gay men's writing group, GuyWriters Playwrights. After several successful productions of the Eat Our Shorts series of short plays, the main writers/producers decided to create our own company to focus on producing original queer-themed plays written by local and national playwrights.

In September of 2012, we cebuted with Family Programming at the Shelton Theatre in San Francisco. Family Programming featured seven short plays from Bay Area playwrights as well as our first national submissions. These quirky, absurd, and over-the-top comedic shorts took audiences on a journey to discover the characters and characteristics of queer family life — both the chosen family and the family we were given. The 4-week run was a success with both audiences and critics alike.

No longer concentrating on the works of just gay men, Left Coast aims to foster the works of all writers interested in producing the best queer-themed works possible. The company has also expanded their productions from one shows year to two, and has plans to increase their productions in the upcoming years.
