WHO IS LCTC?

Left Coast Theatre Co. was formed in the Spring of 2012 from the successful gay men's writing group, GuyWriters Playwrights. After several successful productions of the Eat Our Shorts series, the main writers/producers decided to create our own company to focus on producing original queer-themed plays written by local and national playwrights.

In September of 2012, we debuted Family Programming at the Shelton Theatre in SF. The 4-week run was a success with both critics and audiences alike, and since then we have been staging 2 shows per year in theatres across SF.

No longer concentrating on the works of just gay men, LCTC aims to foster the works of all writers interested in producing the best queer-themed works possible. We have thus far been nominated for 2 TBA Awards for BEST ANTHOLOGY - Twisted Fairy Tales and #WTFamily (winner, 2015).

Erica Andracchio (Chris/Stage Manager) is a Bay Area native raised in the East Bay.
