Left Coast Theatre Co. was formed in the Spring of 2012 to focus on producing original queer-themed plays written by local and national playwrights.

In September of 2012, we debuted *Family Programming* at the Shelton Theatre in SF. The 4-week run was a success with both critics and audiences alike. *Left Coast News* is our 8<sup>th</sup> full production.

LCTC aims to foster the works of all writers interested in producing the best queer-themed works possible. We have thus far been nominated for 4 TBA Awards for BEST ANTHOLOGY: Twisted Fairy Tales, #WTFamily\*, Screaming Queens\*\* & San Francisco, Here I Come\*\*. The company has also expanded our productions from one show per year to two anthology shows and continues to grow and develop new and creative original works.
